Remember there is a range of possibilities of where and on which level of a tree branch you are matching.

There is no hard & fast rule; it could be a generation closer, or one level further back, due to the random amounts of DNA you and your DNA cousins have received. It's at times a lottery draw of the amounts of DNA you inherit! Autosomal DNA matches ARE NOT an exact relationship prediction based on shared DNA alone. Down the track if you get a parent, sibling or grandparent match coming into your account, you will then be able to link to these and more accurately place the more distant and uncertain branches of your tree.

Digging up your roots, you won't have the time or inclination to cook, garden or do anything.

As my husband mused, "I used to have a wife until she started DNA genealogy."
